

Meet BUD, a Quirky East Texas Bully who Luckily Was Adopted by a Loving Family KNOW YOUR BREEDER

This month's story from the owners of BUD is unfortunately fairly typical and presents a view into life with a dog diagnosed with Obsessive Compulsive Disorder. We Thank BUD's owners for sharing their story with us and helping to educate others in their search for a life-long Bull Terrier companion.

When we bought our Bull Terrier BUD as a puppy he was a beautiful dog and seem normal at first. When he started getting older we started noticing problems. BUD started to spin around some at $4\frac{1}{2}$ months old and he progressively got worse, so we started doing research. We then realized he had problems. Several weeks later BUD started pouncing on objects that weren't there and making a whining noise.

I called the breeder who said that he had no complaints at that time and he didn't know what would be causing these symptoms. We took BUD to the vet and discussed the problems we were having. The Vet then put him on several different medications, none of which helped. Later after doing more research we called the breeder back to let him know what we had found out and he admitted at that time having others call saying their puppies were displaying strange behaviors. He then offered us another puppy, but by then we were already attached to BUD.



As BUD got older he got obsessed with chewing on sticks, metal and bricks, wearing his canines smooth to the gum line. Now he is obsessed with making a whining type howl and dancing around at the base of trees, which now we know as OCD.

Bud has gotten better with age, but still acts abnormal at times.

We love him very much and do not think he's a dangerous dog, but we have to warn people about his behavior. BUD turned five December 17th and is just a lovable 65lb lap dog with quirky ways.

When we started looking for a breeder, this one was close. When looking at the puppies and the mother they seemed to be in clean conditions, but after some reflection it seemed to me that although they were cared for physically, there were probably not getting much in the way of personal attention. The kennel was clean and the dogs seem healthy. We should have looked closer at why he was selling puppies. Now as we look back, in our opinion it was all about the money and not the breed. If we ever get another dog we will be more responsible in getting to know the breeder.
